

- Douglas County's Local Health Officer Dr. Thomas Marcellino: "With the recent uptick in cases, we want to remind the public the cornerstone and foundation of preventing the virus is in mask usage."
   "We appreciate the businesses in our community that have closed in the past under earlier health orders, and now that they are open, we are asking for their continued cooperation by requiring employees to wear masks," Lawrence-Douglas County Public Health Director Dan Partridge said.
