



Grade levels of children represented in survey





Parent estimate of distance from child's home to school









Percent of children who have asked for permission to walk or bike to/from school by distance they live from school










Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school

1259417	I would allow my child to walk to school if she didn't have to cross the intersection at 15th st and Haskell st
1259432	I will not let my daughters walk or bike to and from school without an adult because of child molesters, kidnapping, and all the other dangerous people that surround us and the careless drivers. If I walk with them then I don't mind.
1259438	Many questions moot for us because the distance is too far. I would love to live closer and walk or bike daily.
1259464	We enjoy walking to school and do so in all kinds of weather. We take the dog and make a family outing to enjoy together.
1259559	We have two kindergartners and a first grader. We believe that, by the time our oldest reaches second grade and the other two are in first, they could walk to and from school by themselves.
1259436	9th St. crossing feels "safe" right now due to limited and cautious traffic. Definite concerns, though, about increased traffic and safety due to 9th St. Corridor.
1259440	We live outside of city limits. Our main concerns are crossing the train track (low visibility and fast cars that take-up whole road over tracks) and time. We are also concerned with the heavy traffic on Delaware (North of 11th) due to Allen Press.
