



Grade levels of children represented in survey





Parent estimate of distance from child's home to school









Percent of children who have asked for permission to walk or bike to/from school by distance they live from school








Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school

1258746	We bike to school with weather and activities permitting. We would love to see a crosswalk from the Clinton Pkwy sidewalk across the access road to Raintree!
1263597	We have biked to school with our children 2-3 times in 7 years. Its guat going but the kids are tired after school.
1268572	Safety is the main reason she does not bike to school
1258699	We live outside of city limits - may not be relevant. If we lived in town - we would walk and bike if distance was doable and route safe.
1258730	My child walks home from school when he has a friend to walk with. Two miles is too far to walk alone (usually). There was no box for that.
1258739	Distance is the biggest factor. While I consider lots of factors in walking, most can be dealt with, so a child could walk some of the time at least. Sadly, distance is too far. Additional consideration is each child is different. I'd trust my older child sooner than my youngest. And since I work at the school, I could verify he arrived safely!
1258742	My children biked to school with husband and sometimes self until they were almost hit at an intersection (they had walk sign) I have taken them to school since. 2.25 miles they loved it. It is only healthy if you don't get hit by a car.
1258757	Walking alone (and following the rules) for this child depends on maturity shown. I am far less likely to set him out on his own at a younger age as he does not always follow directions like his brother!
